VOTING IN WISCONSIN WITH A CRIMINAL CONVICTION

You do NOT need
Photo ID to vote in the
April 5th elections.

If you were convicted of a **FELONY** and as of Election Day you are “**off paper**,” in other words NOT

- **Incarcerated** • **On Probation** • **On Parole**, or
- **On Extended Supervision...**

YOU CAN VOTE!

**ONCE YOU HAVE COMPLETED YOUR FELONY SENTENCE,
YOU CAN REGISTER TO VOTE.**

If you were convicted of a **MISDEMEANOR**, you **never** lose your right to vote, but if you're in jail on Election Day, you have to vote by absentee ballot.

Vote to empower yourself, your family and your community. Vote so the needs of your community are met by those in office. Vote because your voice is important and deserves to be heard!

To register to vote in person at the Clerk's office, the deadline is 5 p.m. or the close of business (whichever is later) on Monday, April 4, 2011.

You can also register at your polling place on Election Day.
